

Ichabod Crane, Washington Irving and the Legend of Sleepy Hollow
Thursday, October 18, 7:30 pm

Neill Hartley presents an all new adaptation of the classic horror story written by Washington Irving. Fully costumed one-man production of the story of the headless horseman draws the audience into the schoolmaster's world in sleepy Tarry Town. This program, followed by discussion about this 19th century author who also wrote Rip Van Winkle, ends with a dramatic reading of the story's postscript.
